



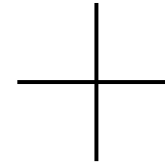
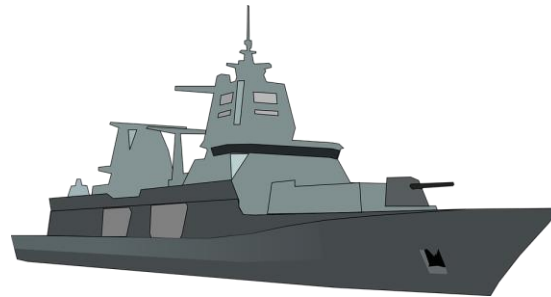
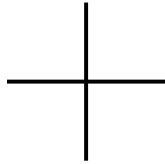

What is NROTC?

- Scholarship designed for College students who are also preparing a future in the US Navy or US Marine Corps in an Officer Role





NROTC Scholarship Benefits



Full Tuition Paid

Graduate with minimal debt

Over 170 colleges nationwide

Payments of required fees, books, and stipends (\$250-400/Month)



Four-Year Degree

Major in a degree of your choice

Up to \$200K Full-ride scholarship



Guaranteed Job

Earn a salary immediately after college

Avg. Starting Salary = 66-76K

Avg. Pay (4 years) = 86-101K



Ultimate Goal

Commission

- Commission as an Ensign or 2nd Lieutenant in the US Navy or US Marine Corps upon graduation

Commence

- Commence your Navy/Marine career with a fundamental understanding of the Navy mission, systems, platforms, capabilities, and leadership principles

Identify

- Identify the officer community into which you desire and are qualified:
 - Surface, Submarines, Aviation, Explosive Ordnance, SEAL, or Nurse for example





Scholarship Programs

- **Nurse Scholarship**
 - Obtain a Bachelor's degree in Nursing (BSN) and commission as a Nurse Corps officer in the Navy
- **2/3/ and 4-Year Scholarships**
 - Pursue technical and non-technical degrees and commission in an operational community
 - Ability to compete as a College Student to earn a scholarship
- **Immediate Scholarship Recipient (ISR)**
 - Automatic screened for a full-scholarship independent of a selection board
- **Minority serving institution scholarship reservation (MSISR)**
 - Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs)
 - Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs)
 - Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs)

Eligibility Requirements

U.S. or naturalized citizen

Or in the process of becoming a U.S. Citizen

17 years old by September 1st of Freshman Year

No older than 27 years old by June 1st of graduating year

Graduate High School By August 1st

Apply and be accepted to NROTC host schools

If selected, you must be a U.S. Citizen in order to activate the scholarship



SAT and ACT Requirements

- SAT Minimum Scores:
- English 550; Math 540
- Combined score 1100

- ACT Minimum Scores:
- English 22; Math 21
- Combined score 44

Valid Test Dates for the FY-25 Scholarship Year are Dec 2020 to Dec 2024.

- **On a case -by-case basis only if Students that did/do not have reasonable access to SAT/ACT testing, the applicant can still apply.**
- **A cumulative High school GPA of 2.75 (on a 4.0 Scale) AND a 2.0 grade (on a 4.0 Scale) in Algebra II (or equivalent course) AND a statement from their high school guidance counselor certifying that SAT and ACT testing was not reasonably available to the applicant.**

*we super-score...meaning we can combine one category from your ACT with the other category from the SAT.

FY24 Cycle Updated Goals

- Total 2900 applications / ~2000 selections

Application, and Trial Period

Applying does not obligate you in any way

Even if you are accepted you can turn it down

You may decline your scholarship prior to the first day of your second year of college

You do not pay back tuition, fees, or stipends

Officer Interview

Full-time service commitment of 5 years. Nurse recipients have a commitment of 4 years.

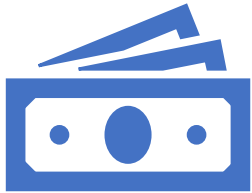


Purpose of NROTC

Develop	Develop Navy midshipmen mentally, morally, and physically.
Imbue	Imbue them with the highest ideals of duty, loyalty, honor, courage, and commitment.
Instill	Instill a basic professional background in the naval service, developing mind and character to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship, and government.



Stipends



Monthly stipend:

\$250 per month your first year

\$300 per month your second year

\$350 per month your third year

\$400 per month your fourth year



Books stipend:

\$750 stipend per year



NROTC Scholarship

\$200K Full-ride scholarship

Payments of required fees, books, and stipends (\$250-400/Month)

Classroom training to include summer training sessions to experience a variety of Navy careers, opportunities, platforms, and experiences

STRICT demands on academics and character

Moral, physical, and leadership development



VA Benefits & Post 9/11 GI Bill

VA Housing

- No down payment
- No Private Mortgage Insurance
- Typically lower interest rates
- Overall, VA home loan benefits are designed to help eligible veterans and active-duty service members achieve their dream of homeownership and provide them with financial assistance and flexibility.
- Example – Obtain home in SD as Ensign...

Post 9/11 GI Bill

- This benefit provides funding for tuition and fees, a housing allowance, and a stipend for books and supplies.
- The amount of funding varies based on the length of military service and the cost of tuition.
- *6 years of service = Transfer to dependents
- Example – 4 years of service, then attend a top MBA while being compensated



Physical Requirements

- No minimum or maximum weight requirements to apply
- If selected for a scholarship, you will be directed to take a Department of Defense medical examination
- Must arrive at college within Navy/USMC height/weight standards

Academic Requirements

- NROTC course load:
 - Naval Science classes
 - Weekly NROTC “Labs” = drill instruction
 - English grammar and composition
 - One year of Calculus
 - One year of Physics
 - National Security Policy/American Military Affairs

Food Allowance(2023) \$ 311

Housing Allowance (San Diego) \$ 3,281

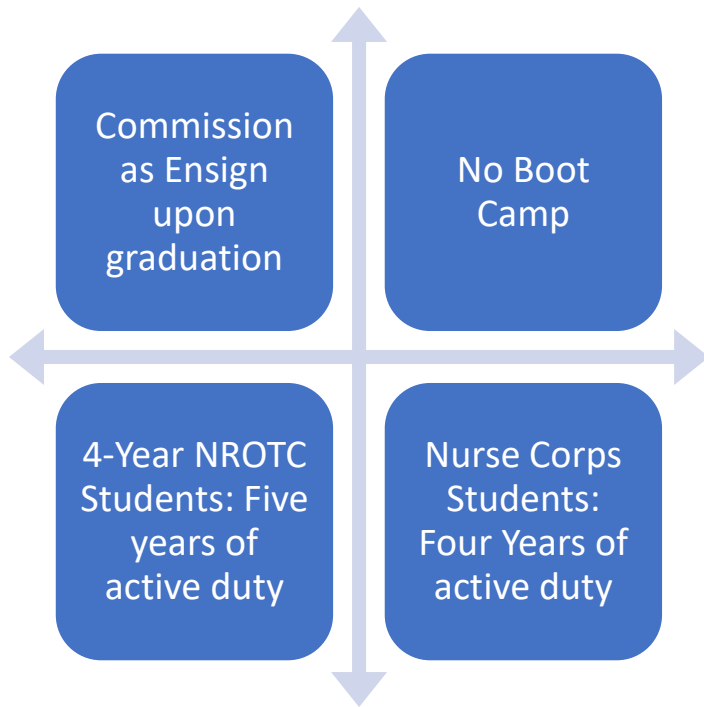
Total Per Month \$ 7,229

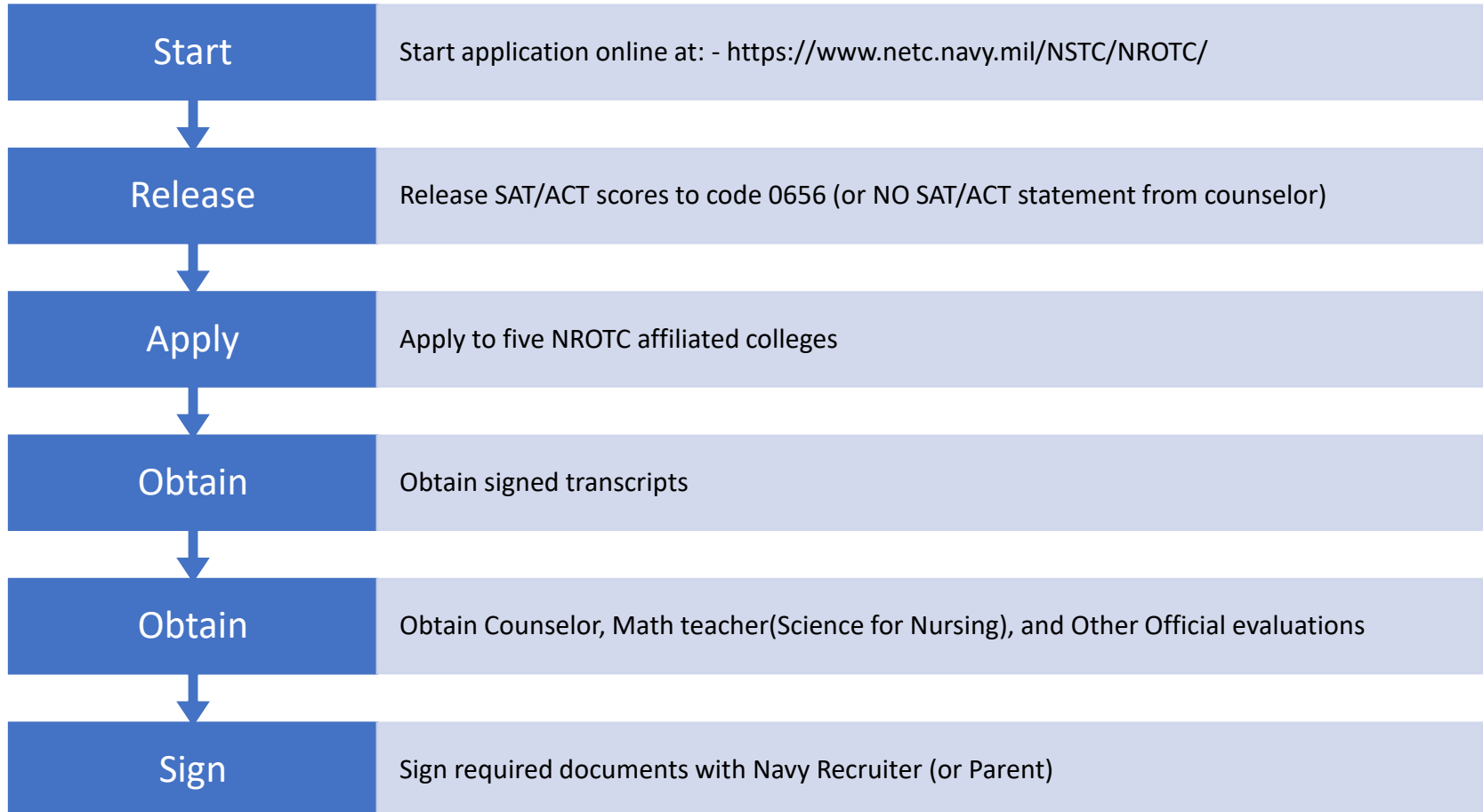
Military Service Obligation
